# Giving assessments

Learning Strategies
SP: Try to become a better active listener. There are great videos on youtube explaining this skill.
SP: If you find reading the textbook in English very difficult, you can have a notebook for commonly used vocabulary.
SP: Try to skim through the whole paragraph first. Note the main idea and key words.
SP: Pay attention to
Ex: Pay attention to the main idea of the reading which usually comes in the first or second sentence.

SP: Try the SQ3R strategy. Survey Question Read Recite Review
SP: Make sure you
Ex: Make sure you write notes and questions as you go in the margins.

SP: Try reading out loud.
SP: A great way to know you understand something is to teach it to someone else.
SP: Be sure to test yourself and do practice exams.
